

LINCOLN-SADBURY REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICT

The basis for the graduated assistance schedule is the Federal government's Health and Human Services 2008 Poverty Guidelines. Other programs such as free and reduced school lunches are also based on these guidelines. In comparing income brackets, Lincoln and Sudbury have high family income, real estate costs and taxes. As a result we expanded the federal guidelines by a multiplier to better match the communities we serve.

Based on information from the most recent census date from 1999 (source: DLS), Lincoln's per capita income was \$49,095 and Sudbury's was \$53,285, both approximately double the State's per capita income of \$25,952. As a result, a multiplier of 200% was used to adjust the guidelines for the full fee waiver. Below is the complete fee waiver/reduction schedule.
